## Guest Speaker For September Meeting Ms Claudia Collins

Claudia Collins, the Adapted Aquatics Director at the Family Y, developed the Family Y Adapted Aquatics Program starting in May of 2002 with 5 participants and the program has served over 1190 participants since then.

Claudia's background is in Aquatics. She is a Red Cross instructor trainer for Life Guarding, water safety and CPR. She is a Master Trainer for Water Art International Aquatic Fitness Certifications. She has her BS degree in Exercise Science from Augusta State University and Aquatic Therapy certifications. The Family Y Adapted Aquatics programs serve all individuals affected by disabilities, both cognitive and physical, of all ages.

In pursuit of providing continued care and opportunity for all individuals affected by physical and cognitive disabilities, The Family Y opened the Kathryn M. York Adapted Aquatics Center in June of 2010. "Katie's Pool" is a 33 x 60 foot, 90 degree, shallow and deep water therapy pool with a zero-entry 42-foot wheelchair ramp. Special features include: a wheelchair to pool hydraulic lift, PVC wheelchairs, PVC parallel bars, three specially adapted changing rooms with one ceiling lift system to accommodate individuals affected by physical disabilities. The state of the art UV sanitation system with chlorine is ideal for those illnesses that are adversely affected by standard chlorine filtration systems.

A sweeping new plan to overhaul the Pentagon's retirement system would give some benefits to all troops and phase out the 20-year cliff vesting system that has defined military careers for generations, the Military Times newspapers reported.

The plan calls for a corporate-style benefits program that would contribute money to troops' retirement savings account rather than the promise of a future monthly pension, according to a new proposal from an influential Pentagon advisory board.

The move would save the Pentagon money -- at a time when it's being asked to cut at least \$400 billion -- and benefit troops who leave with less than 20 years of service. The yearly contributions might amount to about 16.5 percent of a member's annual pay and would be deposited into a mandatory version of the Thrift Savings Plan, the military's existing 401(k)-style account that now does not include government matching contributions, according to the Times.

Proponents said the plan would allow more flexibility for servicemembers, who could decide how they want to invest their retirement savings, and for the military, which would be allowed to offer higher contributions to troops who deploy frequently or take hardship assignments

**Senate Seeks \$80B in Benefit Cuts**

The Senate deficit-cutting plan proposed by the so-called "Gang of Six" could mean a reduction in retiree COLA and demands that the armed services committees make \$80 billion in cuts to military entitlements over the next decade.
